1.1 - Why are you running for this office? Give no more than your top 3 reasons. *

I have served on the Orinda City Council since 2015 and am currently the Mayor of Orinda - I would like to continue my service to my community.

I have a broad depth of experience in Orinda -- having served on the Council for 9 years and being a 35 year Orinda resident that gives me insight into community issues; resident concerns and critical matters affecting the city. I want to continue working toward solutions on the key issues that Orinda faces.

My experience is especially helpful to Orinda given that in 2025 we will have a new city manager, a new police chief, a new fire chief and a relatively new planning director. If re-elected, I will be the most tenured member of the city council and I want to use that experience to reduce the learning curve for the new staff and help ensure that our city priorities remain on track.

1.2 - What are the responsibilities that come with the office you are running for? *

The commitment to attend a wide range of local and regional meetings; stay well-informed on issues and city business; work closely with city staff; and be responsive and available to both staff and the community.

Besides my existing city council experience, I am a registered California civil engineer with an extensive career in transportation and infrastructure that gives me great insight into public works and infrastructure issues. I also have an MBA from UC Berkeley and over 30 years of professional managerial experience in the private sector with responsibility for hundreds of employees and major financial objectives. Professionally, I have a great deal of expertise which I have been able to bring to issues and needs at the city.

I am confident I have demonstrated the ability to listen to residents and interact successfully and respectfully with the community; as well as the ability to deal with tough situations professionally and with integrity.

My husband and I are 35 year residents that raised our family in Orinda. It was a wonderful set of experiences that I believe has given me a great deal of understanding and insight into the community and what the residents value.

- 1. Continuing work toward long-term sustainable infrastructure plans for funding and maintenance --- in 2024 I initiated a special subcommittee to receive input and make recommendations to the full council I plan to work toward implementing the recommendations.
