- 1: Affordable Housing, 2:Environment 3: Equity in Brentwood for POC
- 1.2 What are the responsibilities that come with the office you are running for? *

Driving the agenda is KEY, ensuring that the agenda is resident focused and not special interest. I will continue to drive key issues to the council. Budget and staying solvent is also a key issue. Ensuring we can meet our pension obligations and continue to offer services to residents. Holding each other accountable is important as well, never rubber stamping items from staff. I have spent many hours learning as much as i can about each agenda item and will continue to do so to ensure i always have educated myself on all agenda items when voting.

1.3 - What are your personal or professional qualifications that you believe make you the best candidate?

I am a senior analytics manager during my day job, and with experience in finance and modeling. This has been helpful when reviewing the city budgets. I also have had to corporate retail experience that has been helpful with working with our economic development team. You can see the positive changes that have benefited the community. The last 3 years have been a great learning experience in the way government works and how to move resident focused items forward.

- 1.4 What are your top goals for this office? How do you plan on achieving them? *
- * 20% inclusionary housing in all new developments, both single family and rentals (up from 13% which i moved forward). I have already brought it forward as an agenda item and will be working with staff to complete a nexus study as a next step.
- * focus on focusing on the youth. I pushed to earmark federal funds to invest a sports complex. I would like to see this completed and not pulled back by staff.
- * we have banned oil & gas in Brentwood and are working on shutting down a gas pipeline that is for private use. I will continue to make that a priority
- * i will work on protecting the remaining agricultural land in the Brentwood area to ensure that our field workers keep jobs and we maintain open space that is key for both food production and climate controlling.
- 1.5 How do you plan on engaging your constituents in dialogue after you are elected? *

I am very active with our resident. I actively do a council meeting recap after all city council meetings which provide residents the highlights and the votes. I also participate in many community events and engage with non-profits to understand what is happening in the community. I will continue to reach out to small businesses to understand what consumers are saying to gauge how to help.

I am a lifelong Democrat that believes in the party mission and am thankful for the big umbrella. This year my mom became a citizen after over 50 years in this country - i am so proud of the work around equity when it comes to city resources. We are embracing POC and lower income residents instead of continually funding the same special interest organizations.

I grew up in East Oakland where the Rough Riders were stationed. This was a volatile time that left an imprint on me and the way i see how people are treated by the justice system. I believe that POC and those of lower income are continually treated differently than people in nicer neighborhoods with higher incomes. While we have appointed attorneys, those with the means are able to hire top-notch representation. What happens is that two individuals that may have carried out the same "crime" will often times see different sentencing results. We need a justice system that treat everyone equally.

We need representation that also serves with compassion and holds others accountable for any type of discrimination, even that of the poor. Everyone should be treated with dignity and as a human. That would go a long way with helping others rise up when they need it the most.

We need a path to citizenship that will ensure fair pay and humane working conditions as well as an active program to help with education goals.

Global affairs, we need to be the beacon of democracy and ensure that our dollars are not aiding in the harm to anyone, as well as helping those in need whenever possible. We need to ensure that we respect differing cultures while promoting peace and acceptance.

It is important, and i speak about it constantly, for the residents to understand where my family and i have come from and why my passion is around equality, in housing, in funding, in education. Having suffered discrimination and watched as my parents dealt with it i will also call out racism. My community has watched me do this and even receive the backlash from those not in agreement that i bring it up during council meetings. This is just one area where i have pushed the envelope and have had some come after me.

PARKS! I do not think you will find anyone that fights more for our kids and creating spaces for them than i do. While city staff would like to take in-lieu fees i have pushed for a park in each new development for the families to enjoy - parks create community and offer a low cost place of entertainment. I will continue to push for affordable housing and will review developer P&L's to show that the profit margins allow for it. I am currently on the inter-agency committee where i sit with Brentwood unified and Liberty union school districts as well as Los Medanos. We work together to ensure our children are being treated fairly and do not suffer from discrimination. We share information that has helped us at the city to develop programs such as the Youth Commission which has started hosting events and we have started to provide grants for.

DPCCC Value: Seniors & Veteran Support Services

- Supports the California Master Plan for Aging including dignified living at home housing options that
 are age, disability, and dementia-friendly; prioritize public housing initiatives over privatization for
 seniors and adults with disabilities; support retraining for those aged 55-65, and extend
 unemployment; oppose mandatory retirement; call for stronger oversight of reverse mortgage
 programs, rigorous prosecution of financial crimes against seniors; support comprehensive singlepayer healthcare, with interim Medicare Part D reforms; support HICAP services, affordable mental

We have a very large senior population with large senior communities. As a city we have invested in our senior center where they have found resources and education. Currently i have heard of a decline in the offerings and have asked for a review of the programs by a third party to see how we can improve. We are working to ensure that we have affordable housing being built in Brentwood and would welcome a 100% affordable housing development.

Our veterans are a big part of the community who have always been supportive. I attend all their events and meet with them to ensure that any challenges in the city are being addressed. We are currently reviewing a project where the county would like to encroach on their property to build a fire house. We need to look at all sides of this project and ensure that the community are protected. Protecting their space will protect the services they are receiving close at home.

DPCCC Value: Affordable Housing & Environmental Protections

Supports eviction protections, rent control/stabilization, anti-harassment ordinances, and habitability
protections; Supports zoning and housing policies that ensure sustainability and affordability,
including infill and mixed-use developments that balance job opportunities with housing availability;
Promotes the integration of green spaces and community gardens in all communities; Supports local
authority in phasing out fossil fuel extraction and preventing the zoning of new extraction sites;
Advocates for strong regulatory measures for setting science-based health and safety setbacks from
residential areas for industrial sites, including oil and gas wells and toxic dump sites.

Brentwood is well positioned to provide thousand of units. Before 2020 the city was not building affordable, the staff would recommend that the developer be allowed to in-lieu out. Our ordinance now requires the units be built at 13% of all new units, and i am working toward 20%.

In Brentwood we have banned Oil & Gas drilling which was being sought after by Reabold in Europe due to the abundance of oil & gas in Brentwood.

I want to take a moment to thank the Sunflower Alliance at the Center for Biological Diversity for all of their help.

We welcome all residents to come to meetings and speak. We are one of the few remaining cities to allow zoom comments. This helps us gain more resident feedback.

The raising of the pride flag brought backlash, but i was happy to do it and be the voice of my neighbors that have faced discriminations that i can only imagine.

accessible, including the ability for Medicare to negotiate drug prices.

Health care is KEY. I am happy to say that i advocated for healthcare for all. In Contra Costa undocumented residents will not be able to receive health care.

A woman's right to chose must be restored, and as Californian's we have to continue to drive this message in hope that a woman's right to her bodily decisions is restored.


