1.1 - Why are you running for this office? Give no more than your top 3 reasons. *

I grew up in Pleasant Hill, and love this city with all my heart. I'm running because we need an experienced leader to help the city navigate the challenges that lie ahead, namely:

- 1: The city faces a looming fiscal cliff. Our pension system is underwater, and high UAL payments to the state threaten to deplete our General Fund as early as 2029.
- 2: The cost of housing has soared to unsustainable levels. When my family moved to Pleasant Hill, we paid the equivalent of half a million dollars (in today's money) for our home. Today, that same home would cost \$1.2 million. The skyrocketing cost of living is leading to displacement of Pleasant Hill residents and must be addressed with swift, bold action.
- 3. Although crime rates in Pleasant Hill are low, we still face genuine public safety concerns. Failure to address the city's financial issues will result in cuts to our police department, hampering our ability to fight crime. Beyond that, Pleasant Hill's transportation infrastructure was not originally built with pedestrian safety in mind, and the city has very few sidewalks or bike lanes. This transportation infrastructure badly needs to be modernized.

1.2 - What are the responsibilities that come with the office you are running for? *

Council sets the city's budget, provides direction to city staff regarding the direction of city operations, and passes ordinances. Much of this work is done via planning documents (e.g. the Housing Element) in which Council works with the community to chart a path forward, and staff then executes that vision.

Councilmembers also serve on various regional bodies (e.g. MTC) and participate in community events.

1.3 - What are your personal or professional qualifications that you believe make you the best candidate?

I have local government experience from serving on the Concord/Pleasant Hill Health Care District Grant Committee, which disburses property tax dollars to community health organizations operating in Concord and Pleasant Hill. I also have financial leadership experience from serving as Controller of the Democratic Party of Contra Costa County, where I helped to develop the budget, performed fiscal forecasts, and ensured adequate liquidity to meet the party's operational needs. I also have a certificate in accounting from UC Berkeley, including specialized training in municipal accounting (which is different from private-sector accounting because it uses GASB standards rather than FASB).

I actively participated in the development of Pleasant Hill's Housing Element, including identifying a technical fix that needed to be made to the city's HPUD zoning provision in order for the Housing Element's rezoning provisions to properly take effect. I'm also broadly knowledgeable about housing, land use, city planning, transportation, and general urbanist issues due to my many years of participating in local politics and my desire to be as well-informed as possible.

1.4 - What are your top goals for this office? How do you plan on achieving them? *

My goals break down into three main areas, corresponding to the three major challenges the city faces:

FISCAL CLIFF: The city's General Fund is currently projected to run out of money in 2029. This is a conservative estimate based on some unrealistic budgetary assumptions, so it's probable (but by no means certain) that we'll have a little longer than that. If elected, I will work with the rest of Council, the city's Finance department, the department heads, and the city's bargaining units as part of a collaborative budget process to extend General Fund solvency through to at least 2032. Once we reach 2032, the last of the city's long-term debt from building the library will be paid off, which will free up about \$2.5 million a year that's currently being used for debt service to instead be used to shore up the General Fund. I'll also work to expand the city's tax base in order to maximize city revenues.

HOUSING: The city needs to build more housing, both so we can meet our RHNA numbers and so we can develop our property tax base. Our current Housing Element is heavily reliant on a small number of sites that are projected to see large numbers of units even though the sites have significant barriers to development (e.g. steep hillsides). Although the Housing Element was certified by HCD, I'm extremely skeptical that it will be a viable path towards actually meeting our RHNA numbers, so I will work to perform a mid-cycle update that will put us on a better footing.

These mid-cycle changes should involve a gentler, more distributed approach. Instead of concentrating development on a small number of sites, which results in significant community backlash and heavy concentration of risk, we should build on recent changes to state law (e.g. SB9 and SB10) to allow for more flexibility in single-family areas, promoting the development of ADUs, duplexes, triplexes, and 4-plexes. The city is already working on a program to pre-approve ADU designs, and we should expand that to also include pre-approved designs for duplexes, triplexes, and 4-plexes.

We also need to reduce the time it takes to bring a project from conception to execution. This is important for the financial viability of projects, since long approval times can jeopardize project financing, and it's also important for stabilizing the General Fund, since we can't realize property tax revenue until the project is actually built. In order to streamline the permitting process, the city should establish an affordable housing zoning overlay in which affordable projects along major thoroughfares are eligible for ministerial approval. This will help bring down costs, increase property tax revenues, and ensure housing for our residents.

PUBLIC SAFETY: The number one priority here is to stabilize the city's finances so we can ensure continuity of service with the police department. Police officers are very difficult to hire, and layoffs in the police department would take a long time to recover from, which could significantly affect the police department's ability to respond to public safety issues.

When it comes to traffic safety, Pleasant Hill recently adopted an excellent Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan, and the next step is to implement it. Top priority should be on the Safe Routes to School program, which aims to build out pedestrian safety infrastructure near schools so children can safely walk to class instead of being driven. This would also serve to reduce congestion around schools (which is horrendous during pick-up and drop-off times), and the decreased air pollution and increased exercise will be good for

students' health. Other priorities include physically-separated bicycle infrastructure, protected crossings along the whole length of the canal trail, and improving the city's sidewalk coverage.

1.5 - How do you plan on engaging your constituents in dialogue after you are elected? *

Pleasant Hill has a long, proud tradition of engaging with the community. My own involvement with the city began when the city was transitioning to district elections, and the community created and debated a large number of district maps during a series of public hearings. Councilmembers also make themselves accessible to the public by attending various community events, including the weekly Off the Grid event at City Hall and the periodic Summer Concerts. It will be an honor to continue that tradition of community engagement.

I've been involved with DPCCC for many years, first as club representative for the Contra Costa Young Democrats, and then as Controller and a member of the Executive Committee. I believe in the incredible good this organization can do, because I've seen it with my own eyes.

If endorsed, I will proudly list the endorsement on my website, and I'll tell voters about it every chance I get. I'll also support the slate card program, and will coordinate literature drops with other candidates who are running in my area.

Many communities (e.g. Pinole and most of Solano County) have passed ordinances banning the construction of new gas stations, and Pleasant Hill should follow suit.

Most of the homes here contain provisions banning black people from residing in them. After those provisions were ruled invalid by the Supreme Court, Pleasant Hill did a large-scale downzoning to drive up housing costs and price black people out of the market. The city is still disproportionately white. I will work to undo this racist legacy and open up Pleasant Hill to everyone, regardless of the color of their skin.
