Richmond City Councilmembers are responsible for policy, decision making and oversight over the entire city- including the budget and all city departments. The city shifted to district elections in which councilmembers are now tasked with representing distinct geographic areas of Richmond, specifically District 1, which encompasses Belding Woods, and portions of the Iron Triangle and North & East. As a predominantly low-income area, my constituents have historically lacked adequate representation in city government and been impacted by underinvestment by city leadership.

1.3 - What are your personal or professional qualifications that you believe make you the best candidate?

I was born and raised in Richmond. I have been an organizer for 13 years fighting for housing, health, and environmental justice. Before I was elected, I attended, listened, and spoken at many city council meetings, other public meetings public events, and organizational meetings. I'm running for re-election to continue to build on the work that I've done in the community and to ensure that the constituents of Richmond have a voice on the city council. I have served on Richmond City Council since 2016.

## Housing Justice:

I support quality, affordable child care. I support a public education system that is inclusive of all students and provides comprehensive curriculum and supportive social-emotional services to students. I am particularly interested in protecting students civil rights through a gender-affirming learning environment and reducing bias based on race and disability. I don't support police in schools.

City leaders can bolster the work of our education system by funding initiatives that serve Richmond youth such as parks, recreational programs and employment programs. We must continue to increase revenue through progressive tax measures, and prioritize use of that revenue for our residents, particularly youth.

## DPCCC Value: Seniors & Veteran Support Services

As a community organizer focused on housing justice, I have directly supported seniors advocating for fair and safe housing. I believe Richmond can provide better services to vulnerable populations including seniors and veterans. Examples include increasing resources for unhoused veterans, investing in our senior centers and supporting programming that serves seniors and individuals with disabilities such as R Transit (paratransit).

Housing justice is of great importance to me, in my day job, it is a central component of my work. As a city council member, we have significant influence over housing policy and interventions for the unhoused. I have actively supported enactment and enforcement of rent control, tenant protections and the COVID-19 eviction moratorium. I am also concerned about working class homeowners and small business owners facing high costs. I also support affordable housing, community benefits agreements, and land trusts. In my day job, housing justice is a central component of my work. Given that Richmond is subject to legislation at the state and federal level, I have used and will continue to use my platforms and influence to advocate for housing policy change at other levels of government.

I support a Just Transition to phase out fossil fuels, and support displayed workers from that industry. This is especially important for Richmond given the presence of the Chevron Refinery. We have other toxic sites in Richmond that need a full environmental clean up.
