Prior candidacy- I ran for this position in 2020 and got 3606 votes. Time spent studying and explaining city budgets and investment reports over the past five years. Professional accounting experience with Flourishing daylilies and training through the adult schools program. And finally, my autism makes me better at identifying patterns and focusing on details, which would make me a better treasurer.

1.4 - What are your top goals for this office? How do you plan on achieving them? \*

Make clear to the community the fiscal challenges Pinole faces, and what the effects would be of each option we can choose to face them. I would do this through social media outreach and through modifying the regular reports submitted to the council, as well as specialized reports as necessary.

Expand the Treasurer's role to more of a Treasurer-Auditor role, to improve public confidence in city government.

Engage with city government more as the Council sees fit, by being at Council meetings.

Increase the yield on the city of Pinole's investments by shifting to higher yield strategies (which will require altering policy). Right now we have substantial funds in the investment fund in equity which is underperforming \*\*cash\*\*. While we remain in a high interest rate environment, we should exploit that.

Social media outreach, being at community events, being at city council meetings, having open contact information for people to ask questions directly. And also hosting regular (monthly) events where the community can come talk to me directly- Chat with the Treasurer or the like.

Ensuring that outreach goes to community groups particularly those not traditionally represented. Ideally, having the city's meetings broadcast in English, Spanish, Cantonese and Tagalog.

My own community has been harmed by a student being allowed to sexually harass others for a significant amount of time. That's unacceptable.

I would support the county's candidate nomination forms having another checkbox for gender other than male or female, as nonbinary individuals could feel forced to select an option lest they be automatically placed into one that does not align with their gender identity. I think that inclusivity makes the City of Pinole stronger, and I would continue to advocate for it in my public statements and who I support.
