1.3 - What are your personal or professional qualifications that you believe make you the best candidate?

I have served on City Council for almost 4 years - 2 as our appointed Vice Mayor. My day job is as Executive Director of a nonprofit serving older adults and adults with disabilities. In a past role I was a Senior District Representative for a State Senator. Having worked both in the for-profit/corporate world and the nonprofit world, I bring a perspective that is fiscally responsible, socially responsible, and resident-driven. I choose my committee and ad-hoc committee positions in areas where I have the most experience, the most passion, and where I can most make a positive impact. I continuously strive to see all sides of an issue and find balance and common ground in my voting whenever possible.

1.4 - What are your top goals for this office? How do you plan on achieving them? *

My goals for the next 4 years in part align with my focus areas for the past 4 years. I would like to continue to push for affordable INCLUSIONARY housing so Brentwood families can live in safe neighborhoods with their friends and peers. We raised our inclusionary percentage to 13%, and I would like to raise it higher to house even more families in need. I have heard from a group of moms that Brentwood needs housing for low-income adults with disabilities. I have started working this staff on this potential project and we are speaking with accessible/affordable housing developers to explore the possibilities. Brentwood is unique in its agricultural legacy. We need to honor that in our planning and make sure to not lose our history by protecting the farms in our sphere of influence. I supported this in part through our Ag Innovation Center planning and will continue to do so. Adaptive recreation is a need in our city and I have advocated for this programming repeatedly. We are at a point when we are now taking steps toward becoming more adaptive in this area but need to keep prioritizing the work. Current council approved significant steps in the planning of our Innovation Center, which will help to bring living wage jobs - a huge priority. We need to stay on task with this developing project and promote other job generating projects so our residents can have shorter commutes and a better quality of life.

1.5 - How do you plan on engaging your constituents in dialogue after you are elected? *

I would like to hold a monthly meet up at rotating sites throughout the city so residents have a consistent day/time when they know I will be available for in-person discussion. I have been an advocate for transparency and effective communication with residents from the start of my council career, so I plan to continue this high level of response.

The DPCCC is recognized in Contra Costa County and beyond as an organization that promotes democratic values, advocates and collaborates on common priorities for the betterment of county residents, and stands strong in support of the candidates it supports. I plan to use the endorsement to demonstrate the organization's support of my candidacy, especially to my voters who are democrats themselves. I have donated to other DPCCC endorsed candidates in the past and supported their campaign efforts. I plan to continue this practice. Many of the issues in my city are common across the county, and as I am a practicing democrat already, I plan to continue my practice of promoting these values in my initiatives and through my votes.

Advocates for high-quality, affordable child care; support programs for low income families including
access to parks and job retraining; ensures educational materials (textbooks, library books) are
inclusive, historically accurate, and reflect scientific consensus including age-appropriate, medically
accurate sex/gender education; replacing sworn peace officers in schools with trained non-police
personnel; Supports policies that respect students' civil rights related to gender expression and
addresses issues like gender-based violence and harassment.

The fact that in 2024 there is a surge of book burnings by groups that can't accept the harsh realities of our history, the fact that families do not always follow so-called traditional models, that gender expression doesn't necessarily align with gender assigned at birth, is appalling. Before I was on council, there was a "drag queen" reading event at our library. I am embarrassed to say that there was a small group of protestors outside of the library when this took place. Not only do we need to prioritize making sure all feel welcome and love is painted with a broad brush in our city, we need to stand against these discriminations when we witness them. As a nonprofit professional, I fully support whatever resources can help our low-income families to thrive and live safe and happy lives.

DPCCC Value: Seniors & Veteran Support Services

- Supports the California Master Plan for Aging including dignified living at home housing options that are age, disability, and dementia-friendly; prioritize public housing initiatives over privatization for seniors and adults with disabilities; support retraining for those aged 55-65, and extend unemployment; oppose mandatory retirement; call for stronger oversight of reverse mortgage programs, rigorous prosecution of financial crimes against seniors; support comprehensive singlepayer healthcare, with interim Medicare Part D reforms; support HICAP services, affordable mental healthcare including issues around isolation, quality caregiving, and increased funding for In-Home Supportive Services. Preserve programs like Adult Protective Services and home-delivered meals; advocate for the removal of the FICA income limit to strengthen Social Security and preserve pensions.
- Champions the needs of veterans and military families by promoting equitable treatment and benefits, access to education including tuition waivers and retraining, adequate healthcare funding including government assistance for those exposed to toxins; elimination of veteran homelessness, establishment of Veterans' Courts and justice programs and support independent investigations of claims of hazing, rape, sexual assault and harassment and that the military remove the chain of command from all investigations and prosecutions; support a path to citizenship for military service members, and protections against discrimination based on ethnicity, disability, gender identity, political affiliation, race, religion, or sexual orientation; oppose deportation of military personnel and limitations on citizenship for children of veterans who are born abroad.

As the Executive Director for a nonprofit serving the rights, quality of life, and safety of older and dependent adults living in long-term care facilities, this question speaks to my heart and it speaks to my area of expertise. I sit on Master Plan for Aging Advisory Councils in two of the three counties my agency serves, and on the Age Friendly Council for the third. I have advocated for legislation and funding for this very vulnerable population at the city, county, state, and federal level. Seniors remain one of our most forgotten and brushed aside sections of our communities, and we need leaders that are committed to taking a stand on behalf of older adults who so frequently do not have a voice of their own. I am working on expanding our housing options in Brentwood for older adults and adults with disabilities. Our city has the largest number percentage of senior residents in East County, so this year I initiated our very first Aging and Disabilities Friendly Community Ad-Hoc Committee. It will become a standing committee in January, 2025.

Veterans have always held a special place in my heart, as I am the daughter, step-daughter, granddaughter, cousin, niece, etc., of family members who have served in the military. I make a point to always attend events that honor our military residents - past and current, and those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice. Our local VFW works hand in hand with other veteran groups in the area and are very active in our community, with full city council support. I stand behind benefits that support all of the areas mentioned.

DPCCC Value: Affordable Housing & Environmental Protections

• Supports eviction protections, rent control/stabilization, anti-harassment ordinances, and habitability protections; Supports zoning and housing policies that ensure sustainability and affordability, including infill and mixed-use developments that balance job opportunities with housing availability; Promotes the integration of green spaces and community gardens in all communities; Supports local authority in phasing out fossil fuel extraction and preventing the zoning of new extraction sites; Advocates for strong regulatory measures for setting science-based health and safety setbacks from residential areas for industrial sites, including oil and gas wells and toxic dump sites.

Prior to my time on council, a very large number of housing developments in Brentwood were approved with ZERO affordable housing units. As soon as we knew we had a council majority who supported inclusionary affordable housing, we voted to remove the possibility of trading affordable units with in-lieu fees for developments over 9 units. We also increased our inclusionary affordable housing percentage to 13% and depending on how the election goes, I would like to take another stab at increasing that percentage again. We have a very large parcel designated/zoned for mixed use housing and jobs, and I am committed to breaking ground on this development in the coming years. Infrastructure is in the works and an anchor project recently started their build. Brentwood Council voted to ban oil & gas drilling within city limits. Council also worked with a resident initiative to get Measure Q on our 2022 ballot, which passed with a clear majority and will work to protect open space in our city.

DPCCC Value: Equality & Human Rights

 Actively advocates for a just and inclusive society, speaking out against all forms of racism, discrimination, harassment, hatred, and violence; Supports movements and initiatives that address discrimination; Enforces policies that ensure equal opportunities and equal pay for equal work across genders, races, and abilities; Upholds the rights of transgender and gender non-conforming individuals for acknowledgment of their stated name, gender, and pronoun; Supports the use of gender-neutral language to foster an inclusive environment; Promotes the participation of women, LGBTQIA+, people with disabilities, and people of color in elected office and ensures access to facilities consistent with individuals' gender identity and disability access; Supports the right to free speech, ensuring it does not extend to discriminatory practices against any group based on race, religion, gender identity, or sexual orientation.

From the time I was elected, I have been advocating for accessibility of our City Council meetings. When other cities removed the ability for the public to comment on agenda items via zoom, I pushed to make sure accessibility was considered, for older adults, adults with disabilities, those who don't drive at night, people with young children at home, and commuters. Unfortunately a majority of council felt compelled to vote against general public comments via zoom after Brentwood joined several other Bay Area cities and was "zoom bombed" by public commentors with hate speech. I hope to bring general comments back, but we continue to allow virtual comments on specific agenda items.

I mentioned in a previous answer that I initiated our city's first Age & Disabilities Friendly Ad-Hoc Committee earlier this year with a goal to make our city more accessible and to focus on more inclusive planning. Another council member initiated our city's first Diversity/Equity/Belonging/Inclusion Ad-Hoc Committee. Again, this committee will become a standing committee in January 2025. While I am a Caucasian woman, I asked to join this committee as an ally. We have already made progress in updating language in our ordinances to be more inclusive and are reviewing instituting DEI policies for the vendors with whom we work, among other things.

DPCCC Value: Healthcare & Reproductive Rights

• Advocates for the preservation of rights under Roe v. Wade, guaranteeing confidential and unrestricted access to reproductive services without the need for consent or judicial intervention, ensuring continued coverage of all healthcare options; Works toward implementing a universal, single-payer healthcare system, while in the interim, seeking reforms to make Medicare Part D more affordable and accessible, including the ability for Medicare to negotiate drug prices.

I fully support women having control of their reproductive healthcare, and have attended community meetings and donated in support of this preservation. I also support the idea of universal healthcare.

DPCCC Value: Economic Justice & Business Development

Support for Small Businesses and Entrepreneurship focusing on women, people of color, and those
with limited entrepreneurship opportunities including veterans; Support the rights of employees to
organize and Project Labor Agreements; Ensures a safe working environment free from harassment,
intimidation, and retaliation; Advocates for the establishment of local banks and credit unions, limiting
regressive financial operations like check cashing businesses and pawnshops; Promotes Project
Labor Agreements to protect workers; Supports initiatives to counteract "food deserts" by developing

I believe in workers' rights and protections. I would like to see fewer fast food restaurants in a section of Brentwood that has more dense zoning for this type of restaurant and is also home to many of our lower income residents. I would not support check cashing businesses and pawn shops coming to Brentwood. I hope to bring accessible community gardens to Brentwood's sphere of influence through our pending Agricultural Innovation Center.
