- 1.1 Why are you running for this office? Give no more than your top 3 reasons. *
- a. Housing: Housing continues to one of my main priorities. I believe we need to continue investing and protecting housing access and affordability. I am proud to have supported the construction of various housing projects in San Pablo over the 6 years that I have served in office. I personally led the effort during the pandemic which created a temporary rent and eviction moratorium and prevented the displacement of residents. I also led in creating a \$500,000 local housing grant assistance program to help eligible San Pablo families impacted by COVID-19 receive financial aid to help pay their rent, mortgage, and utilities. In addition, I recently led with creating the city of San Pablo rent registry and worked with city staff to make sure residents are informed of the rental protections granted by AB 1482 and the newly enacted bill by Assemblymember Haney which prevents landlords from charging more than one month's rent as a deposit if certain conditions are met. I am also closely watching ongoing statewide efforts to help with the financing, construction, and protection of affordable housing.
- b. Economic Development: I know that to protect financial viability of San Pablo, we must look at alternative ways to diversify our revenue stream and wean our dependency on casino revenue. I have supported local businesses by helping create a San Pablo Back-2-business grants, invested in our San Pablo Economic Development Corporation that helps provide guidance and support to our businesses, and worked with various partners to recruit and retain professional workforce development training and employment opportunities. I plan to continue identifying new revenue streams for our community and make sure we have a strong and healthy budget for years to come.
- c. Health: The need for access to healthcare institutions and services are not lost on me. I believe that after losing Doctors Medical Center, we lost a gem that provided key services to already-vulnerable populations in our city and region. Even though the hospital has closed, I am proud that we have been proactive in recruiting and retaining various medical services. That includes having Lifelong Medical Center providing Urgent Care, primary care, and dental services for the undocumented, underinsured, and noninsured patients. We also have the Rotacare Clinic which moved from Richmond to San Pablo that provides care and services to people in our city and region. Additionally, we have Women Infants and Children Center and the West County Mental Health Center that opened all within walking distance. We are also partners with the County A3 program and will be deploying mental health services to our region from San Pablo. While I recognize that these providers may not replace a full-service hospital, I do appreciate that we have made efforts in the right direction. I believe we need to continue to create pathways for people to have access to vital health resources and opportunities. I will continue to support efforts that assist our residents in having greater access to health-related services.

1.2 - What are the responsibilities that come with the office you are running for? *

Attending and voting in City Council meetings, representing my community, advocating for issues impacting my community, creating and supporting change.

1.3 - What are your personal or professional qualifications that you believe make you the best candidate?

I am a lifelong San Pablo resident and a first-generation college graduate of UC Santa Cruz with a B.A. in Sociology. My path to public service was significantly shaped by a tragic event in 2007 when I lost my best friend to gang violence in San Pablo. Motivated by mentors who recognized my potential, I used my personal experiences into advocating for informed and impactful public policy changes. During my time at Richmond High School, I was elected by my peers to represent them on the School Site Council. I also played a pivotal role in establishing both the City of San Pablo and the West Contra Costa Unified School District Youth Commission, both of which are still active to this day.

In the realm of state politics, I have had the privilege of serving the constituents of Assembly District 15 as a Principal Field Representative for former State Assemblyman Tony Thurmond, spanning his two terms in the state legislature. In 2017, I ran for California Democratic Party Delegate, emerging as the youngest candidate and securing the highest number of votes among male candidates. Subsequently, I continued my public service as Principal Field Representative with State Assemblyman Rob Bonta of District 18 in 2019, focusing on crucial issues such as public safety, education, health, insurance, social services, and transportation.

In 2020, I reached another milestone in my career by being sworn in as the Northern California Regional Field Liaison for State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond.

I have also made history as City of San Pablo's youngest elected official at age 26, Vice Mayor at age 29, and, at age 30, assuming the role as Mayor. I stood amongst the youngest Mayors to ever serve in California and the United States.

1.4 - What are your top goals for this office? How do you plan on achieving them? *

Supporting the construction of housing in my community, helping diversify our revenue stream, and supporting access to greater health-based resources for my community.

1.5 - How do you plan on engaging your constituents in dialogue after you are elected? *

By inviting them to our council meetings and having them speak on the issues that are important to them, meeting with them in the community, attending events, etc...

I have supported other Democratic candidates locally, regionally, and across the state of the years. I continue to do so to this day and will continue to fight for democratic values.
